<u>A Saluting Our Patriot Ancestors</u>. Patrick Wesolosky has initiated a new Chapter ceremony to honor our Patriot ancestors. The ceremony, similar to what some other Chapters are now doing, will have a Chapter member stand and say their ancestors name out loud along with the involvement they had during the Revolutionary War. The ceremony ensures that our treasured Patriots that sacrificed so we can have our freedom are remembered. It also reminds us that all those in the SAR are here to recognize these Patriots and learn about the historical surroundings of each during the Revolution. It will be a great way to honor our ancestors and learn more about fellow Chapter members and history. The schedules for these "Patriot Salutes" are still in the planning stage.

Honor Flight Scheduled. At long last a Bluegrass Honor Flight is scheduled for October 20th. For the last two years the flights were canceled due to Covid. We all look forward to going to the airport to welcome home all the veterans who traveled to Washington, DC to visit monuments for the day. Hopefully this flight will occur without being canceled due to the new Covid outbreak. More information on this event will be coming later this month.

Louisville - Week of Valor. The annual Week of Valor events is now being planned for Veteran's week in November. At this time the Chapter will be involved in multiple events that week including the "reverse parade" and other ceremonies listed on the schedule page. Other events are now being added to the schedule when they are confirmed. This includes a special Veterans Program at Klondike Elementary School on November 10th.

2021 Wreaths Across America, Zachary Taylor National Cemetery.

In 2020 social isolation protocols made it a challenge for the annual *Wreaths Across America* ceremony at Zachary Taylor National Ceremony. However, with perseverance and planning by Scott Giltner the placement of wreaths on the graves of Veterans was still accomplished. The National Cemetery Administration, managing all Federal Veterans cemeteries, required only 10 people can be in the cemetery as a group. So, the memorial ceremony was limited to ten people and held on Friday, December 18th. The actual placement of wreaths on the

graves was December 19th and required scheduling of 10 people at a time to place wreaths and then leave for others to then place theirs. Even with obstacles, the Governor Isaac Shelby Chapter was still able to honor and remember those who served and sacrificed for our country in the military. However, this it is expected that the regular ceremony will return like the ones from previous years. More information about the 2021 Wreaths Across Ceremony will be forthcoming as we get closer to December.

<u>Kent Hathaway - Chapter Historian</u>. Usually the Chapter Historian just keeps records, notes and other materials for future posterity and maintain the history of the Chapter. However, Kent Hathaway has expanded the role by being a true "historian" for the Chapter by presenting a historian event that happened during the Revolutionary War. This has added to one of the SAR and Chapter goals about educating ourselves about the war and events of those times. Some of the presentations have included The Battle of Gloucester, Massachusetts and the Siege of Fort Ticonderoga. Kent's efforts are appreciated by the Chapter.

- <u>Upcoming Chapter Directory</u>. The social isolation due to the Coronavirus has shown the Chapter that there is an increased need for a detailed Chapter Directory. There have been some problems with communications with all members of the Chapter, updated email addresses and ensuring that everyone is kept up to date with Chapter activities. Due to this a detailed Chapter Directory is being developed that will be available to all members of the Chapter and other Chapters as requested. This committee helped to create new Chapter awards for Color Guardsmen, Women Veterans and Military Chaplains under Chapter Champlain Eric McClain.

 - WaterStep Shoe Project. The WaterStep organization in Louisville is now collecting usable used shoes for third world countries. To help with this the Governor Isaac Shelby Chapter will ask for any shoe donations starting in February. If you have any new or old shoes, boots, etc. that are usable we will be putting out a call and start collecting them in February and March.
